1894: YWCA created in Harrisburg with 9-bedroom boarding house, reading rooms and a noon rest program.

1920: Phyllis Wheatley branch formed.

1955: YWCA branches desegregate.

1971: "Eliminating racism" adopted as part of mission.






External and Internal Assessment

- Creating a more diverse organization

- ▶ Stepping back as individuals. Stepping up as an organization

Reproductive Justice

- Planned Parenthood is not a "RJ Organization"
- ▶ But can be a good partner to reproductive justice organizations!
- Understanding intersectionality



Reproductive Health Reproductive Rights Reproductive Justice

Movement	Framework
Reproductive Health	Emphasizes necessary reproductive health services
Reproductive Rights	Emphasizes gaining constitutionally framed legal protections for those services
Reproductive Justice	Stipulates that reproductive oppression is the result of the intersections of multiple oppressions and cannot be alleviated without strategies to address them all

Community Engagement, Not Outreach

- Outreach is (at best) done "for."
 - ▶ Outreach, keeps the "outreacher" at the center.
 - ▶ "Targets" of the outreach are outsiders.
- ► Community engagement is done "with."
 - ▶ Rooted in relationship building.
 - ▶ Factoring in the interests and needs of the community

Community Engagement, Not Outreach

as homogenous; class, intra-religion and gender differences mean that many feel underrepresented or misrepresented

leaders around role they can play in sustaining well-being of the community and relationship with partner organization.

Empower: communities and the individuals within them so they are better able to look after own well-being and well-being of others.

Managers as Lead Learners

- Managers should set an example of continued learning and growth. (This is how things change)
- "Lead Learning" helps to empower individuals to grow
- Challenges harmful or outdated organizational structures



Lessons Learned


